Subject: LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

1. **The following bills have been introduced in the 2013-14 legislative session that have a potential direct impact on the Employment Training Panel (ETP) program:**

### **AB 1476 - Budget Act of 2014**

**SUMMARY:** AB 1476 is a budget cleanup bill that contains amendments to various boards, departments, and agencies. Among other things, AB 1476 will increase ETP's appropriation by \$10 million in the current fiscal year.

**STATUS:** AB 1476 was enrolled and presented to the Governor at 4 p.m., on Wednesday, September 10, 2014, and currently awaits the Governor's signature.

### **AB 2148 (Mullin) Workforce Development: Annual Workforce Metrics Dashboard**

**SUMMARY:** AB 2148 will require the California Workforce Investment Board (Board) to assist the Governor in the development of an annual workforce metrics dashboard that measures the state's human capital investments in workforce development and that provides a status report on credential attainment, training completion, degree attainment, and participant earnings from workforce education and training programs.

This bill will authorize the State Department of Education to collect the social security numbers of adults participating in adult education programs and will require the Employment Development Department to aggregate and report data provided by workforce program partners to the Board. The Board shall convene workforce program partners to develop a standardized set of inputs and outputs for the workforce metrics dashboard.

Further, the workforce metrics dashboard shall measure the performance of the community college career technical education, the Employment Training Panel, Title I and Title II of the federal Workforce Investment Act of 1998, Trade Adjustment Assistance, and state apprenticeship programs.

**STATUS:** AB 2148 was enrolled and presented to the Governor at 3:30 p.m., on Monday, September 8, 2014, and currently awaits the Governor's signature.
